After making their information selection, respondents read a real news article that had appeared on the topic from the source they chose. This means there is variation in whether respondents could encounter the correct answer to the subsequent question while browsing the article, though most articles would at least briefly mention it. Across the studies, the lone source that would not contain the correct answer would be the partisan media source for which the information was uncongenial.

Below we indicate whether the article contained this information with a 1 for articles that contained the relevant information for respondents and 0 otherwise. We also note that, when it came to partisan media sources, some articles did report uncongenial information but often undercut this by providing more extensive treatment of inaccurate claims from other actors on the topic.
