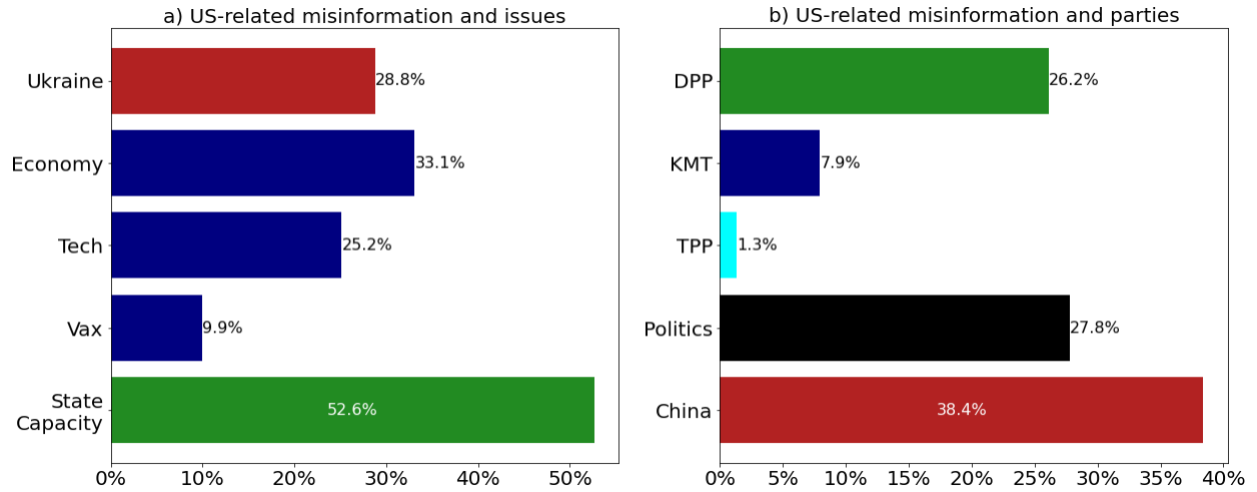

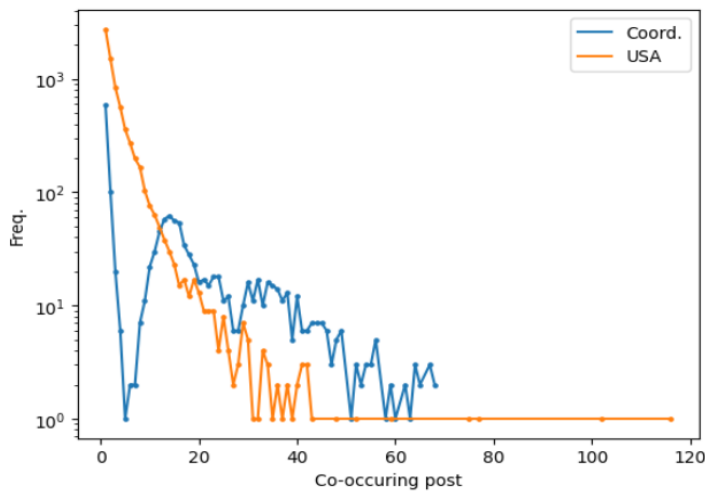

**Table A1.** Top post and comment content summarized by ChatGPT. Like Reddit, PTT involves an original post and subsequent comments.
